Mayor Kelley said those cities were allowing golf carts as a strategy to promote their downtowns. He spoke regarding how golf carts are being used in Minneola.

He suggested that the Villages would be a good source for data on the frequency and extent of golf cart-related accidents. He stated he was not in favor of golf carts on streets. He mentioned Sun City near Tampa as another golf cart-centric community, and that Minneola is not predominantly a golf cart community.

Vice Mayor Serviss spoke regarding the manual for low-speed vehicles.

Daniel Smith provided the state definitions of golf carts and low-speed vehicles.
