Public Comment

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Keith Severns, Academica Representative, explained they are reviewing new information received from the engineers. They are exceeding 50 turns per hour and are looking at alternatives such as utilizing bussing to get under the 50 turns per hour.

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Mayor Kelley explained that the Council answers to the public for the traffic, and he will not support the project without a turn lane. He explained that moving forward without a turn lane will require going back through the process to have the Planning and Zoning Commission re-evaluate the project. He said he would like to see the school grow and succeed, but a turn lane is needed.

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Vice Mayor Serviss said she supports expanding but is also concerned about the traffic and growth in that area. She expressed the importance of doing it the right way to avoid future traffic issues as we have experienced in the past.

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Councilor Flinn and Councilor Price agreed with Mayor Kelley and Vice Mayor Serviss.

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110 Councilor Saunders commented that bussing should help traffic.

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112 Mayor Kelley commented that even if the stacking is solved and bussing is added, having people slow down to make a sharp right hand turn off a four-lane road in the morning will cause a backup.

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115 **Vice Mayor Serviss** commented that it's a great school, and we support the the expansion if done correctly.

This is first reading, so no vote is necessary. 149 150 Joyce Heffington explained that this is for security purposes to require "No Trespassing" signs on vacant land to allow authorities to act when necessary. The Planning and Zoning Commission 151 recommended approval but requested a definition of vacant properties, so that short term vacancies 152 such as for sale properties are excluded. 153 154 155 **Public Comment** 156 157 Paul Giacalone, City resident and Planning & Zoning Commission Member, commented on the importance of enacting the vacant land ordinance and his support for the requirement of a turn lane 158 for the Pinecrest expansion. 159 160 Gustavo Ortiz, City resident, spoke regarding the ordinance and utilizing organizations to help 161 162 the homeless people. 163 164 Mayor Kelley confirmed that the City Manager reaches out to the homeless people and tries to 165 get them help. 166 167 Vice Mayor Serviss commented that some people like living this way even when employed and it's their choice. Although the City Manager offers them help and resources, some refuse the 168 169 assistance being offered. 170 171 FINAL PUBLIC COMMENT 172 Paul Giacalone asked about appointing another Planning and Zoning Commission Member. He 173 confirmed he didn't think another member was needed. However, he would like a deputy at the 174 175 meetings. 176

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Mark Johnson:

- Advised that the builder for Publix was supposed to use split face block wall but made an honest mistake due to miscommunication. They are offering to build a second wall, use a veneer, or stucco the current wall. It is a large wall and needs to look appealing.
 - o Mayor Kelley commented that he would prefer not to stucco it.
 - Council consensus was to let Mark Johnson determine the best option for the wall.
- Stated Jack's restaurant would like to serve mixed drinks, but they can't obtain the type of license needed due to not having enough seats. The quota license they have allows them to do pretty much anything. However, the owner has promised his intent is a restaurant and he is willing to sign an agreement to that fact.
 - Scott Gerken explained that even though he has a license that will allow him to do more than restaurant sales such as a liquor store, the owner agrees to sign an agreement limiting it to restaurant sales.
 - Council consensus was to allow the use of the quota license with the agreement limiting the use to restaurant sales.
- Commented that workshops need to be scheduled for Pine Bluff H.O.A. and for Commercial/Industrial standards. He asked if it was ok to schedule these workshops on off Tuesdays. Council agreed, but Vice Mayor Serviss commented she wouldn't be available on April 13, 2021.

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Scott Gerken:

• Informed the Council that Mr. and Mrs. Szkwarko were interested in the City vacating the right-of-way next to their property, but that he informed them that was highly unlikely at this time.
