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## **COUNCIL DISCUSSION & ACTION ITEMS**

## Item 4: Public Safety Complex Construction Project - Bid Award

Mark Johnson explained that after awarding the bid to the lowest bidder, the bidder stated prices had gone up and they could not fulfill their obligation at their original bid price. This request is to award the project to Marbek Construction, Inc. which is the next lowest responsive bidder.

**Scott Gerken** announced for full disclosure that his legal firm has a conflict regarding Evergreen Construction, Inc. (not representing Evergreen or the City), who was the lowest bidder, as their firm has done work for them in the past. Therefore, he cannot be involved in the dispute with Evergreen Construction, Inc. but that the City has outside counsel advising them.

MOTION by Vice Mayor Serviss, SECONDED by Councilor Price, to approve the Public Safety Complex Construction Project bid award to Marbek Construction, Inc. subject to successful construction contract negotiations with the company.

## <u>Item 5: Ordinance 2021-23 – Home Occupations – 1st Reading</u>

**Scott Gerken** read Ordinance 2021-23 by title only. As this is first reading, no vote is necessary.

Joyce Heffington explained that this ordinance is in response to legislation passed by the Florida Legislature preventing the City and other local governments from prohibiting home-based businesses operating in residentially zoned areas. Business Tax Receipts can still be charged. We are still able to regulate these businesses similar to commercial zoning regarding noise, parking, waste, etc. Therefore, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended changes, so home-based businesses must abide by other regulations that other businesses are required to abide by such as payment of commercial refuse fees if they generate a lot of waste.

**Scott Gerken** clarified that this legislation does not change or prevent the Homeowner's Associations authority from regulating or prohibiting home-based businesses in their subdivisions.
