8 Joe Saunders, Grant Watson (Assistant City Attorney), Mark Johnson (City Manager), and Kristine
9 Thompson (City Clerk).

11 **CALL TO ORDER BUDGET HEARING**

13 **Mayor Kelley** called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

15 A moment of silence was observed, and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by **Ian Wood, Eagle**
16 **Scout**.

18 **Mayor Kelley** announced that the purpose of the hearing was for the adoption of the fire protection
19 special assessments, tentative millage rate, and the proposed budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024

21 **Grant Watson** read the Fire Rescue Assessment Resolution No. 2023-17 by title only.

23 The budget hearing was paused at 6:32 p.m. in order to read the proclamation included on the City
24 Council meeting agenda.

49 **Mayor Kelley** announced the tentative millage rate for 2023-2024 is 5.700. The current year
50 rollback rate is 6.2332. The current year tentative millage is less than the current year rollback rate.

52 **Grant Watson** read the Tentative Millage Rate Resolution 2023-13 by title only.

54 **Mark Johnson** presented the balanced budget and listed line items included in the budget. The
55 current millage is 5.8, this request will lower the millage to 5.700 which is lower than the current
56 rate and the rollback rate.

58 There was a discussion regarding other items that are included in the budget.

62 **Richard Garvie**, 827 Maple Forest Avenue, asked what the difference in revenue is between a
63 millage rate of 5.7 and 5.8.

65 **Mark Johnson** advised the difference in revenue between the two millage rates.

68 increased.

70 **Jennifer Morse**, 1064 Golden Dawn Loop, inquired about other items included on the budget.

72 **Nathan Focht**, 707 Blue Citrus Lane, spoke about surplus amounts.

75 **millage rate of 5.700 for fiscal year 2023-2024 by Resolution 2023-13.**
