She said the HOA received a letter after the conditional use 31 permit didn't pass stating they were prohibited from accessing the property and the landscaping 32 was removed after that. She said he further emailed that he had conferred with the Lake County 33 Sheriff's Office to have anyone driving on his road be issued a moving violation.
